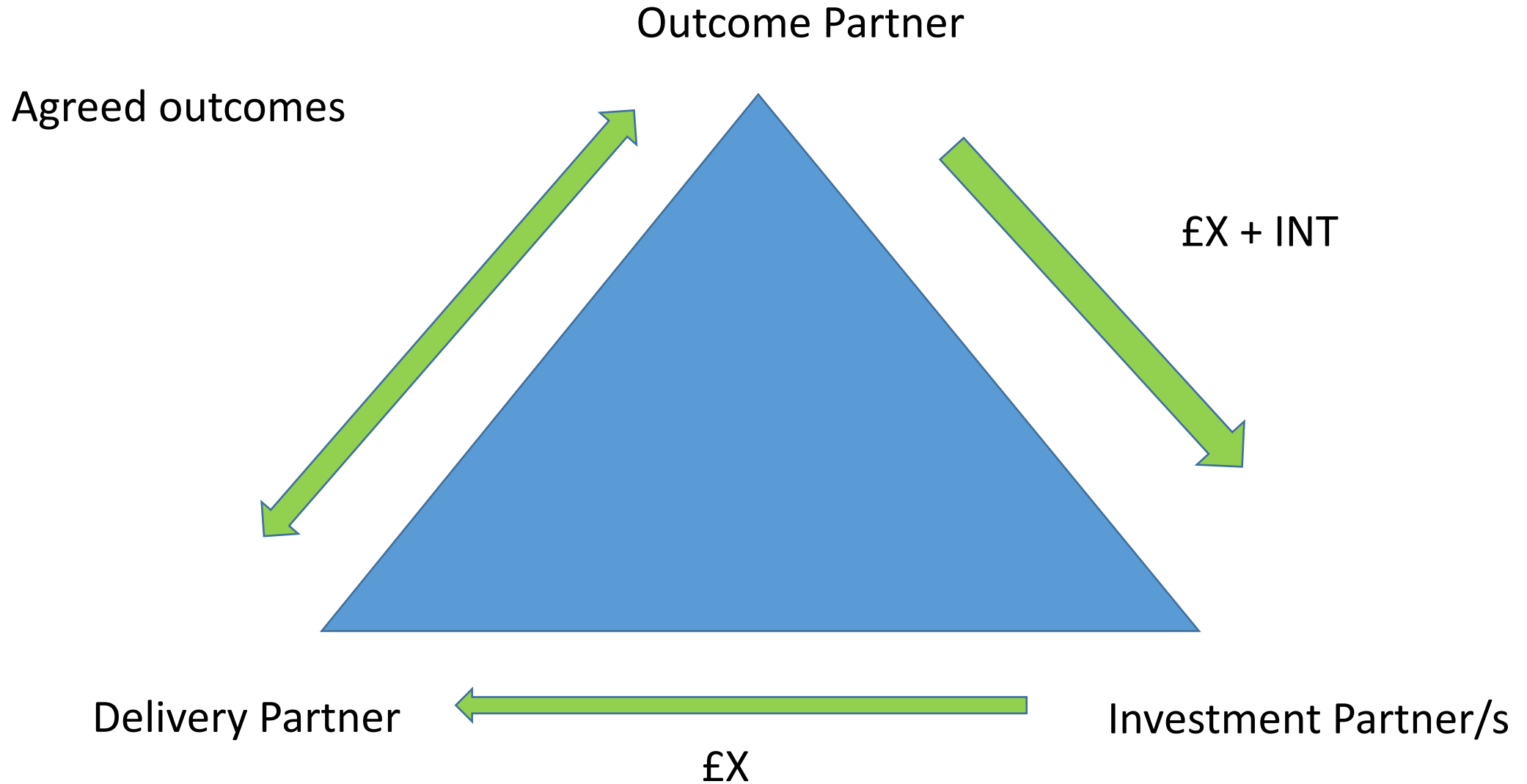

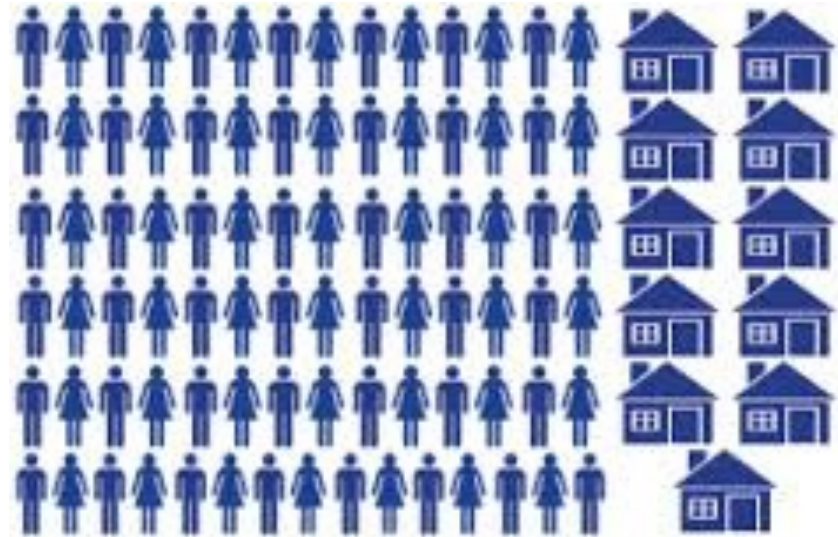
Social Housing in Scotland

- 1999/2000 - 75% of families with dependant children in rented accommodation were in Social Housing. 2012/13 – less than 50%
- Rented housing doubled in 10 years – those in social rent fell from 40% - 25% in 20 years
- Housing tenure is changing – vital it develops with Social Justice / Mobility in mind
